The museum is located on Nicolson Street. You enter the museum grounds through this gate.




This will take you into our courtyard where you will see 4 statues. There are benches to sit on in this courtyard.



You will enter the building through the glass doors.



You can find the museum on level 3. You can access level 3 via the stairs or lift which can be found behind the staircase.





When you reach level 3, you will go through this door to our reception.

Museum staff wear a black uniform with the Surgeons' Hall Museum logo on it.




They will also be wearing a lanyard with The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh on it.


The museum is spread out over 4 floors. You will be given a map when you arrive.



Museum Layout

Our History of Surgery museum is located on level 3. In the middle of the gallery is a recreation of a dissection. Some visitors may find this loud. There are lots of glass cases in this area which contain old surgical instruments and human remains. There are also paintings and statues in this area.





Level 3- History of Surgery Museum

The temporary exhibition is on level 3 beside our ticket desk. The layout of this space will change depending on the exhibition.




Level 3- Temporary Exhibition

The Anatomy Lab is our education space. Schools use this area with our Learning Officer. This space is often closed.




Level 3- Anatomy Lab

Level 3- Shop

Our Wohl Pathology Museum is split over 2 levels. Lower pathology can be found on level 2. On this level there are human remains on display. There are also some videos with audio that play on this level.




Level 2- Lower Wohl Pathology Museum

The upper level of the Wohl Pathology museum can be found on level 4. There are human remains on display in this area. The sound from the lower gallery can travel up to the upper level.



Level 4- Upper Wohl Pathology Museum

Our Dental Collection and Techniques and Technology galley can be found on level 5. As this space is open above the History of Surgery Museum, the sounds from level 3 can be heard up here too.



Level 5- Dental Collection & Techniques and Technology

Body Voyager can be found on level 5. You need to go through this glass door to enter. Sometimes this door is closed and you will have to open it.



Level 5- Body Voyager

Body Voayger lighting levels are different from other spaces in the museum. When you walk through the glass door you will see a large projection of a beating heart. You will hear the heart beat as well as some people talking over the heartbeats.




Level 5- Body Voyager

Body Voyager looks at the development and use of robotics in surgery. There are several of interactives for visitors to use. There are some human remains on display in this area.
